We have recently been reflecting on the work which has taken place through HSCP during the last year and engaging in conversations with all relevant agencies around how we work together to make a positive difference to the lives of children and their families. In June 23, we spent a productive afternoon with safeguarding partners across Hull to start to formulate the HSCP plan for 2023/2024. It was great to be part of engaging and collaborative discussions around how we continually make progress and improvements in relation to our responses to contextual safeguarding, neglect, domestic abuse, learning and strengthening further our multi-agency arrangements in Hull. These areas have all been agreed through the HSCP Executive Board as priorities for the HSCP over the next year

I recently had the opportunity to attend the Child Safeguarding Practice Review Panel Conference in London which included hearing from young people about the importance of always ensuring that their voices are central to shaping practice and hearing about work taking place to improve responses to children in need of protection. During the event, discussions took place around the consultation which is currently open relating to the revision of `Working Together to Safeguard Children'. A number of proposed recommendations are made within the Working Together consultation



document, including emphasising the importance of building trusting relationships, strengthening family networks, strengthening multi-agency arrangements and proposals that children supported under S17 ('Child in Need' - CIN) can be supported by a lead practitioner who does not need to be a social worker. The guidance has not been revised since 2018



and the consultation closes on 6th September 23. This newsletter details further information and links in relation to the guidance and it is recommended that everyone involved in safeguarding children reads the proposed updates and takes the opportunity to provide their views in relation to this.

Within this newsletter there are details of the training offer available through HSCP for 2023/2024. This training is available to all agencies who have safeguarding responsibilities for children, alongside additional learning activity which continually takes place via the HSCP and other safeguarding agencies across Hull. We are also pleased to confirm that an updated version of the HSCP tri-x will be available from August 2023 which will improve the accessibility and ease of navigation for all relevant agencies who wish to access safeguarding guidance and procedures. Please also find details below of the Humber-wide domestic abuse training entitled, 'Economic Abuse and the Impact for Victims / Survivors and their Children'. The event includes Rachel Williams sharing her own deeply harrowing experience of domestic abuse. Positive feedback has been received from practitioners who have already accessed the events and additional dates are available in September 23 and November 23.

Working Together to Safeguard Children: changes to statutory guidance



Through an open consultation, the DfE are currently seeking views on the revised statutory guidance, Working Together to Safeguard Children 2023. The final version of this is due to be published at the end of 2023. The closing date for feedback to be provided to the DfE is **6th September 2023**.

A number of proposed recommendations are made

within the Working Together consultation document, including emphasising the importance of building trusting relationships, strengthening family networks, strengthening multi-agency arrangements and proposals that children supported under S17 ('Child in Need' - CIN) can be supported by a lead practitioner who does not need to be a social worker.



The DfE consultation is open and in the public domain. Relevant documents, including the draft for consultation, can be accessed through the links below. I would encourage everyone to read the draft changes to statutory guidance (a summarised version is also attached).
